Meeting at the Township Hall called to order at 6:30 PM by Supervisor Blake-Thomas. The Pledge of Allegiance and Roll Call of Board Members; Supervisor Blake-Thomas, Treasurer Sindles, Trustee Loomis, Trustee Simpson, and Clerk Hillman present. A quorum of the Township Board was in attendance.

1. Motion by Trustee Loomis to approve the general meeting minutes of June 13, 2023 as written. Second Treasurer Sindles Voice vote: All yes with no 'Nay' votes. Motion carried unanimously.

#### **Public Comments:**

- 1. Thank you from the Pride Committee to all that helped make the 4<sup>th</sup> holiday a successful celebration.
- 2. Thanks to the Pride Committee for championing the 4th activities, holding fund raising activities throughout the year, coordinating the parade, fireworks, and Mini-park Craft fair.

3. A lot of supportive comments on the fireworks display being well presented.

4. The 'no personal fireworks in the park' request was well received and contributed to a relaxed and festive atmosphere.

#### Park Report: Supervisor Blake-Thomas

- 1. Reservations so far this year are more than all of 2022 as of this report
- 2. No incidents in the park over the 4th thanks to Alan, Crystal, Brian, Dan, and Jeremy as park monitors.
- 3. The showers are reportedly working well and the upgrade was appreciated by the campers.
- 4. **Motion** by Trustee Simpson to accept the park report. Second Treasurer Sindles Voice vote: All yes with no 'Nay' votes. **Motion carried unanimously**.

#### Old Business:

- 1. The Trout Lake Township Hall debt of ~\$18,000 will be paid off in full this month. The 2023 winter property tax bills will be adjusted to remove the appropriate millage.
- 2. A draft of a Township Noise Ordinance was presented in detail with significant discussion. A decision on adoption of this ordinance was postponed to the August Board meeting.

## **New Business:**

- Motion by Supervisor Blake-Thomas to approve a pass-through grant of \$3,000 to the Trout Lake
  Historical Society. Second Clerk Hillman. Voice vote: All yes with no 'Nay' votes. Motion carried
  unanimously.
- 2. Highline fiber internet \$200 connection fee discussion. Board to consider paying the entire connection fee for all residences (~500 buildings) in Trout Lake Township from the Township general fund.
- 3. Chapel needs repairs to railings and soffit. Trustee Loomis will get estimates. **Motion** by Supervisor Blake-Thomas to approve the repairs subject to review and approval of the estimates by the Supervisor and Clerk prior to the work. Second Trustee Simpson. Voice vote: All yes with no 'Nay' votes. **Motion carried unanimously**.
- 4. Chapel dead tree needs to be removed. **Motion** by Clerk Hillman to authorize Davis Tree, Newberry to remove the tree for an estimate cost not to exceed \$800. Second Supervisor Blake-Thomas. Voice vote: All yes with no 'Nay' votes. **Motion carried unanimously**.
- 5. Concern of cars parking at the Mini-park too close to the railroad tracks during events. All actions deferred.

#### **Public Comment:**

1. The trimming of the large tree in the Mini-park will stay the removal for a year to see if it recovers.

## **Board Comments:**

#### Supervisor Blake-Thomas:

- 1. Speed limit sign entering Trout Lake on H40 from the west. Check with CCRC for a new sign.
- 2. Thanks to the Pride for all the great work making the parade, fireworks, craft sale a success. The Women's Club ice cream social on Sunday was also well attended.
- 3. Next year add a Board staffed dunk tank on the 4th with kudos to the one with the most donations raised. Trustee Simpson: The Mini-Park looks great.

**Motion** made by Supervisor Blake-Thomas to pay the bills as submitted by Clerk Hillman. Second Trustee Loomis. Motion approved unanimously by the Board Members in attendance with a voice vote. Supervisor Blake-Thomas motioned to adjourned the meeting at 8:00 PM.
